BACKGROUND:

Throughout the year, our schools look in depth at student achievement. As a result of that focus on student achievement, School Site Councils utilize that information to assist in the development of the school plan (Single Plan for Student Achievement), which incorporates student improvement goals with a spending plan. As required by the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), all plans must be aligned with the LEA Plan approved by the Board in March 2010. Emphasis in the Single Plan must be on language arts and math, and include strategies to improve performance of student groups that are not meeting grade level standards as measured by the Smarter Balanced Assessment. School Site Councils have also been working to align Site Plans with the Local Control Accountability Plan once it has been developed.

PROGRAM/EDUCATIONAL IMPLICATION: The sites' Single Plans reflect:

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE WESTSIDE UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT APPOINTING AND EMPLOYING CERTAIN CONSULTANTS IN CONNECTION WITH THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE DISTRICT'S BOND REFUNDING PLAN AND APPROVING CERTAIN RELATED ACTIONS

WHEREAS, on November 8, 2008, an election was held within the Westside Union School District ("District") in which qualified electors approved a ballot proposition authorizing the issuance of up to \$63,500,000 in bonds to finance specific construction, repair and modernization projects approved by the voter ("Measure WS");

WHEREAS, on June 15, 2010, the Board of Trustees adopted a resolution approving the issuance of the General Obligation Bonds, 2008 Election, Series B ("2008 Series B Bonds");

WHEREAS, on April 12, 2010, the District issued the 2008 Series B Bonds in the amount of \$34,998,930.95;

WHEREAS, as a result of a favorable interest rate environment and improvements in the credit quality of the District it is in the public interest to explore the opportunity to refund the 2008 Series B Bonds ("Refunding Plan");

WHEREAS, the District desires to appoint and employ certain consultants to assist the District in developing, structuring, and implementing the issuance of bonds ("Proposed Bonds") for the purpose of refunding the 2008 Series B Bonds; and

WHEREAS, all acts, conditions and things required by the Constitution and laws of the State of California to exist, to have happened and to have been performed precedent to and in connection with the actions authorized hereby do exist, have happened and have been performed in regular and due time, form and manner as required by law, and the District is now duly authorized and empowered, pursuant to each and every requirement of law, to undertake such actions for the purpose, in the manner and upon the terms herein provided;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Westside Union School District, as follows:

Section 1. All of the recitals herein contained are true and correct and the Board of Trustees so finds.

Section 2. California Financial Services is hereby appointed as the District's Financial Advisor to provide the services required for: (i) the development and implementation of the Refunding Plan; and (ii) the issuance of the Proposed Bonds. The Assistant Superintendent, Administrative Services of the District is hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on

Advisor to provide the services required for: (i) the development and implementation of the Refunding Plan; and (ii) the issuance of the Proposed Bonds. The Assistant Superintendent, Administrative Services of the District is hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the District, to enter into a contract with such firm for the provision of services as the District's Financial Advisor.

Section 3. The Assistant Superintendent, Administrative Services of the District is hereby authorized and directed, jointly and severally, to do any and all things, which he/she may deem necessary or advisable in order to carry out, give effect to and comply with the terms and intent of this Resolution including the hiring of additional consultants as needed.

Section 4. All actions heretofore taken by the officers, employees and agents of the District with respect to the Refunding Plan the issuance of the Proposed Bonds are hereby approved, confirmed and ratified.

Section 5. This resolution shall take effect from and after its date of adoption.
