GREGG ANDERSON UNIFORM POLICY

Uniforms

Students attending Gregg Anderson Academy are required to wear uniforms. If unsure about colors or styles, please verify with store clerk or school personnel prior to purchasing. School principal has final authority on anything not covered in this policy.

Please adhere to the following guidelines:

Overall rules and regulations

1. Uniforms must be free of holes, tulle, sequins, glitter, lace, sheer, leather, pleather, velvet ruffles, and sparkle.

2. School colors are navy and silver (gray).

3. Collars must be visible at all times.

4. No rules for shoes other than they must adhere to district policy.

5. Tops and bottoms must be in the following solid colors: navy blue, burgundy, gray, white, black, or khaki.

6. Please put child's name on all jackets, sweatshirts, beanies, hats, caps, etc. in permanent marker that is clearly visible.

Shirts

1. Must have a collar. (No sleeveless collared shirts).

2. Embroidered school logo optional not required. (Available through Land's End or B's Embroidery). No other logos are allowed.

3. Turtlenecks or long sleeve shirts may be worn under collared shirt. Turtlenecks or long sleeve shirts that are visible must be a solid color in navy blue, burgundy, gray, white, black, or khaki.

4. Collared shirts are not required to be tucked in.

Vests

Solid colored vests in uniform colors are allowed. This includes: navy blue, burgundy, gray, white, black, or khaki.

Bottoms

1. Bottoms consist of pants, shorts, skirts, capris, skorts, and bermudas.

2. Student may wear leggings, jeggings or tights in navy, burgundy, gray, white, black or khaki under dresses, skirts, or shorts.

3. Tight fitting bottoms are not allowed.

4. Shorts and skirts must be long enough that when student is standing up straight with arms at sides, bottom of shorts or skirt is at least as long as student's middle finger.

5. Denim is not allowed except for blue denim on Spirit Fridays with Spirit Shirt or on Special Days.

6. Sweats are not allowed except in FS (Functional Skills) classrooms.

7. Belts are not required. Kindergarteners and 1st graders are discouraged from wearing belts.

8. Bottoms must be appropriately fitted.

9. Polo dresses may be in navy, burgundy, gray, white, black or khaki.

Sweaters

1. Pull over, zip-up, snap up, button up, velcro snap, or open front sweaters are allowed.

2. Sweaters without hoodies over a collared shirt in solid school colors (navy blue, burgundy, gray, white, black, or khaki) are allowed.

Sweatshirts

1. Must be a solid zip-up uniform color (navy blue, burgundy, gray, white, black or khaki); or GAA school zip-up sweatshirt; or zip-up from a college (doesn't include NFL, NBA, NHL, MLB, etc.)

2. Cannot be a pullover sweatshirt of any type.

3. Sweatshirts are defined as soft, non-weather proof material on the exterior.

4. Sweatshirts can have no words, lettering, accent colors (such as colorful zippers, hood, etc.) or logos such as Old Navy, Gap, etc.

Coats/Jackets

1. Denim jackets of any color are not allowed.

2. A coat/jacket is defined as outerwear that is only worn outside (weather proof material).

3. If you are unsure if an article of clothing is a coat/jacket or sweatshirt, it must be solid navy blue, burgundy, gray, white, black, or khaki.

Caps/hat/beanies/earmuffs

1. Must be worn properly (bill forward)

2. Must be GAA, or a solid uniform color, or from a college team (doesn't include NFL, NBA, NHL, MLB)

3. Worn outdoors only

4. Beanies cannot be of animals, mo-hawks, etc.

Socks, Ties, Scarves, and Belts

Must be in solid colors to include: navy blue, burgundy, gray, white, black, or khaki.

Picture Days

Students must be in uniform for Fall Picture Day.

Free dress is allowed on Spring Picture Day.

Spirit Days

All Fridays except free dress days.

Spirit wear is defined as wearing a school spirit shirt. Spirit wear can be purchased through the PTA. Solid blue jeans or uniform bottoms are allowed on Spirit Days when wearing a GAA Spirit Shirt. Otherwise, uniforms are required. Spirit shirts cannot be altered in any way.

Free Choice Days

One Friday a month, students who didn't serve detention during the month are allowed to wear

clothing of choice as long as choices meet district dress code.

Students who receive detention during the month must be dressed in school uniform (not spirit wear) on Free Dress Fridays.

Student Council Days

Student Council Days are days established by our student council to promote spirit. These days may include: pajama day, sports day, crazy hair day, crazy sock day, etc. Otherwise, uniforms are required.

Special Days

During the month of October, students will be allowed to wear their favorite Halloween or black/orange shirts on the following three Fridays of the month,

During the month of December, students will be allowed to wear their favorite Holiday shirts on the two Fridays before the winter break.

In addition, students will be allowed to wear their favorite Valentine shirt on February 14, favorite Dr. Seuss shirt when we celebrate Dr. Seuss' birthday and favorite St. Patrick's Day shirt on March 17 (depending on school calendar). Themed accessories such as Santa Hats and Dr. Seuss Hats are allowed on Special Days.

All site plans are reviewed for compliance along with goals and activities to improve student achievement and parent involvement before being forwarded to the Board for approval.

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING is approved and entered into as of this 14th day of June, 2017, by and between Westside Union School District and Masada Homes Community Mental Health. In consideration of the promises and of the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter contained, and for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, Westside Union School District and Masada Homes do hereby covenant and agree as follow:

1. Term of Agreement:

This Agreement shall commence on July 1, 2017. Thereafter, unless sooner terminated as herein provided, this Agreement shall automatically be renewed annually for successive one (1) year terms.

2. Termination:

Either party to this Agreement may terminate the Agreement, with or without cause, upon thirty (30) days prior written notice.

3. <u>Services</u>:

Masada Homes shall provide counseling/therapy and psychiatric services to Westside Union School District students (hereinafter, services are collectively referred to as "services"). All services shall be provided at no cost to students. Masada Homes Community Mental Health will bill Medi-Cal for service provided. ALL students seen must be eligible for EPSDT Medi-Cal with NO share of cost (Full Scope) and meet medical necessity based on Medi-Cal criteria. Services are dependent on available funding. ALL services shall be provided by licensed therapists and/or by unlicensed interns under the direct supervision of licensed therapists, licensed physicians and in class positive behavioral interventionists.

4. Staff Requirements:

Masada Homes shall notify the District of all persons performing services to District students. Masada Homes shall also notify the District of all persons no longer performing services to students.

No person shall perform any services or have any contact with students pursuant to this Agreement unless Masada Homes first provides Westside Union School District with prior written proof, demonstrating that person's compliance with each of the following requirements:

- A. Each therapist/practitioner providing services pursuant to this Agreement shall submit proof of holding appropriate license or be under the supervision of a therapist holding such license.
- B. Each therapist/practitioner, unlicensed intern, or other person having contact with students pursuant to this Agreement shall submit proof of complying with tuberculosis examination, in the manner described in Education Code 49406(a) and shall be determined free of active tuberculosis.
- C. Each therapist/practitioner, unlicensed intern or person having contact with students pursuant to this Agreement shall submit proof of clearance from the Department of Justice, for fingerprinting examination.
- D. In the event Masada Homes is notified by the Department of Justice of any circumstance that could potentially change the DOJ Fingerprint clearance status of any therapist/practitioner, unlicensed intern or other person having contact with students at Westside Union School District, Masada Homes agrees to promptly notify Westside Union School District of the change including but not limited to notice of subsequent arrest.

5. Supervision of Staff:

While engaged in the performance of this Agreement, Masada Homes is an independent contractor and is not an officer, agent or employee of Westside Union School District. Masada Homes shall be solely responsible for provision of services pursuant to this Agreement, and shall ensure adequate supervision and training of all personnel.

6. Approval:

No person shall perform any services or have any contact with students without prior approval from Westside Union School District. Individuals providing services to district students shall submit a services provider application to Westside Union School District. It is understood that Westside Union School District may grant or deny such approval with or without cause.

7. Parental Consent:

No services shall be provided to any students pursuant to this Agreement without prior written approval from the student's parent/guardian. Masada Homes shall develop, and utilize, in all cases and for each student, a standardized parent/guardian consent form.

8. Student Privacy and Pupil Records:

Masada Homes shall not have access to student names, addresses, or other pupil record information without prior written parent/guardian consent, as herein provided. Masada Homes Community Mental Health and Westside Union School District shall jointly develop procedures whereby students may be identified for referral, and whereby referrals may be transmitted to the parent/guardian. All such procedures shall protect student privacy.

Confidentiality of pupil records shall be maintained. Masada Homes agrees to maintain any and all pupil records in a secure location.

Additionally, client/pupil records held by Masada Homes must be maintained securely and confidentially in accordance to HIPAA Laws to protect patient privacy.

9. Insurance:

Masada Homes agrees to maintain in full force and effect throughout the duration of the Agreement, a suitable policy or policies of professional and general liability insurance, insurance against all bodily injury, property damage, personal injury, and other loss or liability caused by or connected to Masada Homes' performances pursuant to this Agreement. Such insurance shall be in amounts not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence; \$3,000,000 for annual aggregate and \$1,000,000 for property damage. Westside Union School District shall not be subject to any deductible or self-insured retention obligation under such policy or policies, and all amounts shall be responsibility of Masada Homes.

All insurance required under this Agreement shall be issued as a primary policy and contain an endorsement requiring thirty (30) days written notice from the insurance company to both parties hereto before cancellation or change in coverage, scope or amount of any policy, Masada Homes, its directors, officers, agetns, employees and consultants, shall be designed as additiona named insured on each and every such policy or policies without obligation for any deductible or self-insured retention as provided in Section 4(b), above. Masada Homes shall provide Westside Union School District with certificate(s) of insurance. All insurance shall be primary and non-contributory as respects of Westside Union School District insured entities. Any insurance or self-insured coverage maintained by the School District shall be in excess of the organizations insurance and shall no contribute with it.

10. Indemnity:

Masada Homes agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Westside Union School District, its officers, agents, employees, and volunteers against all claims, damages, losses and expenses including attorney's fees arising out of the performance of the work described herein, caused in whole or in part by any negligent act or omission of the organizations, anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them or anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable, except where causes by the active negligence, sole negligence or willful misconduct of the School District.

11. District Facilities and Equipment:

Westside Union School District agrees to provide reasonable and adequate space to Masada Homes at mutually convenient times to enable Masada Homes to provide services pursuant to this Agreement. Westside Union School District additionally agrees to provide, Masada Homes with access to copiers, facsimile machines and telephones to enable Masada Homes to provide services pursuant to this Agreement.

12. Compliance with Laws:

Both parties shall comply with all applicable State and Federal Laws.

13. Notices and Approval:

Any notice pursuant to this Agreement shall be made in writing, via United States mail, to the person identified immediately below, which persons shall also be responsible for final approval of all forms and/or procedures referenced herein.

BACKGROUND:

Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF)

The 2013–14 budget package replaced the previous K–12 finance system with the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF). For school districts and charter schools, the LCFF created base, supplemental, and concentration grants in place of most previously existing K–12 funding streams, including revenue limits and most state categorical programs.

The LCFF legislation eliminated most state categorical funding streams. Categorical funding received in 2012–13 formed the basis for determining an LEA's funding in the phase-in period under the LCFF.

More specifically, the LCFF target amount includes grade-span specific, base, supplemental, and concentration grants, with add-ons for the former Home-to-School Transportation and Targeted Instructional Improvement Block Grant Programs. The actual LCFF entitlement in any given year will be determined by adding the following amounts together: (1) 2012–13 general purpose funds and funding from a list of categorical programs, (2) a transition amount that, after full implementation, will bridge the difference between 2012–13 funding and the LCFF target, and (3) an add-on for economic recovery, if applicable. Except for the Home-to-School Transportation program and Targeted Instructional Improvement Grant, categorical program amounts included in the 2012–13 funding level calculation are no longer separately identifiable funding; they were identified initially only as a means to develop an aggregate funding amount for use in calculations.

Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP)

As part of the LCFF, school districts, COEs, and charter schools were required to develop, adopt, and annually update a three-year Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP The LCAP is required to identify goals and measure progress for student subgroups across eight state priority areas. Districts must include in their LCAP (1) actions, services and expenditures for all students and subgroups and (2) additional actions and services for "unduplicated pupils" including low-income students, English learners, foster youth and redesignated English learners. The superintendent must review the Single Plan for Student Achievement from school sites to ensure the actions in the LCAP are consistent with strategies in school plans submitted pursuant to education code 64001.

The LCAP must be developed in consultation with teachers, principals, administrators, other school personnel, local bargaining units, parents and students. It must be reviewed by two advisory committees, a parent committee including parents of students in the unduplicated pupil group and an English learner advisory committee, composed of a majority of parents of English learners, for districts with 50 or more English learners comprising at least 15% of the total population. The superintendent must respond in writing to comments from these

committees. The superintendent must notify members of the public of the opportunity to submit written comments regarding specific actions and expenditures in the LCAP.

The LCAP and the district budget must be presented at a public hearing prior to the board meeting at which the LCAP and the budget are adopted. The LCAP must be approved by the local school board at the same meeting, but prior to adoption of the district budget.

No later than five days after adoption of the LCAP, the governing board shall file the LCAP with the county superintendent of schools.

Exhibit 5123- Promotion/Acceleration/Retention

The Promotion/Retention Analysis forms were revised to be more useful at the site level and to align with, and ensure compliance with, current board policy and administrative regulation. These forms were created to replace the current exhibit that was last revised in October 1999.

Board Policy/Administrative Regulation 5141.2- Suicide Prevention - Replace

AB 2246 mandates that districts serving grades 7-12 to adopt policy on suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention by the beginning of the 2017-18 school year. Because implementation of the mandates result in substantial changes to the existing policy and regulation both are being replaced. Both the policy and regulation address the staff development to be provided to teachers in grades 7-12 and the need to target specified high-risk student populations. In addition, both the policy and regulation add best practices in prevention, intervention, and postvention, including, but not limited to, student instruction, crisis intervention procedures, follow-up care for a student who threatens or attempts suicide, and the provision of counseling and other postvention strategies to reduce suicide contagion.

Suicide Prevention

Students

BP 5141.52(a)

The Board of Trustees recognizes that suicide is a leading cause of death among youth and that school personnel who regularly interact with students are often in a position to recognize the warning signs of suicide and to offer appropriate referral and/or assistance. To attempt to reduce suicidal behavior and its impact on students and families, the Superintendent or designee shall develop measures and strategies for suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention.

In developing measures and strategies for use by the district, the Superintendent or designee may consult with school health professionals, school counselors, school psychologists, school social workers, administrators, other staff, parents/guardians, students, local health agencies, mental health professionals, and community organizations.

Such measures and strategies shall include, but are not limited to:

1. Staff development on suicide awareness and prevention for teachers, school counselors, and other district employees who interact with students in the middle school grades

2. Instruction to students in problem-solving and coping skills to promote students' mental, emotional, and social health and well-being, as well as instruction in recognizing and appropriately responding to warning signs of suicidal intent in others

3. Methods for promoting a positive school climate that enhances students' feelings of connectedness with the school and that is characterized by caring staff and harmonious interrelationships among students

4. The provision of information to parents/guardians regarding risk factors and warning signs of suicide, the severity of the youth suicide problem, the district's suicide prevention curriculum, basic steps for helping suicidal youth, and/or school and community resources that can help youth in crisis

5. Encouragement for students to notify appropriate school personnel or other adults when they are experiencing thoughts of suicide or when they suspect or have knowledge of another student's suicidal intentions

6. Crisis intervention procedures for addressing suicide threats or attempts

7. Counseling and other postvention strategies for helping students, staff, and others cope in the aftermath of a student's suicide

As appropriate, these measures and strategies shall specifically address the needs of students who are at high risk of suicide, including, but not limited to, students who are bereaved by suicide; students with disabilities, mental illness, or substance use disorders; students who are experiencing homelessness or who are in out-of-home settings such as foster care; and students who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or questioning youth. (Education Code 215)

Students

AR 5141.52(a)

Staff Development

Suicide prevention training shall be provided to teachers, counselors, and other district employees who interact with students at the middle school level. The training shall be offered under the direction of a district counselor, psychologist and/or in cooperation with one or more community mental health agencies.

(cf. 4131 - Staff Development) (cf. 4231 - Staff Development) (cf. 4331 - Staff Development)

Materials for training shall include how to identify appropriate mental health services at the school site and within the community, and when and how to refer youth and their families to those services. Materials also may include programs that can be completed through self-review of suitable suicide prevention materials. (Education Code 215)

Staff development shall include research and information related to the following topics:

1. The higher risk of suicide among certain groups, including, but not limited to, students who are bereaved by suicide; students with disabilities, mental illness, or substance use disorders; students who are experiencing homelessness or who are in out-of-home settings such as foster care; and students who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or questioning youth

2. Individual risk factors such as previous suicide attempt(s) or self-harm, history of depression or mental illness, family history of suicide or violence, feelings of isolation, interpersonal conflicts, a recent severe stressor or loss, family instability, impulsivity, and other factors

(cf. 5131.6 - Alcohol and Other Drugs)

3. Warning signs that may indicate depression, emotional distress, or suicidal intentions, such as changes in students' personality or behavior and verbalizations of hopelessness or suicidal intent

4. Protective factors that may help to decrease a person's suicide risk, such as resiliency, problem-solving ability, access to mental health care, and positive connections to family, peers, school, and community

5. Instructional strategies for teaching the suicide prevention curriculum and promoting

mental and emotional health

6. School and community resources and services, including resources and services that meet the specific needs of high-risk groups

7. District procedures for intervening when a student attempts, threatens, or discloses the desire to die by suicide

Instruction

The district's comprehensive health education program shall promote the healthy mental, emotional, and social development of students and shall be aligned with the state content standards and curriculum framework. Suicide prevention instruction shall be incorporated into the health education curriculum at appropriate secondary grades and shall be designed to help students:

1. Identify and analyze signs of depression and self-destructive behaviors and understand how feelings of depression, loss, isolation, inadequacy, and anxiety can lead to thoughts of suicide

2. Develop coping and resiliency skills and self-esteem

3. Learn to listen, be honest, share feelings, and get help when communicating with friends who show signs of suicidal intent

4. Identify trusted adults, school resources, and/or community crisis intervention resources where youth can get help and recognize that there is no stigma associated with seeking services for mental health, substance abuse, and/or suicide prevention

(cf. 5131.6 - Alcohol and Other Drugs)

Intervention

Students shall be encouraged to notify a teacher, principal, counselor, or other adult when they are experiencing thoughts of suicide or when they suspect or have knowledge of another student's suicidal intentions.

Every statement regarding suicidal intent shall be taken seriously. Whenever a staff member

AR 5141.52(c)

suspects or has knowledge of a student's suicidal intentions based on the student's verbalizations or act of self-harm, he/she shall promptly notify the principal or school counselor.

Although any personal information that a student discloses to a school counselor shall generally not be revealed, released, referenced, or discussed with third parties, the counselor may report to the principal or student's parents/guardians when he/she has reasonable cause to believe that disclosure is necessary to avert a clear and present danger to the health, safety, or welfare of the student. In addition, the counselor may disclose information of a personal nature to psychotherapists, other health care providers, or the school nurse for the sole purpose of referring the student for treatment. (Education Code 49602)

(cf. 5141 - Health Care and Emergencies)

A school employee shall act only within the authorization and scope of his/her credential or license. An employee is not authorized to diagnose or treat mental illness unless he/she is specifically licensed and employed to do so. (Education Code 215)

Whenever schools establish a peer counseling system to provide support for students, peer counselors shall receive training that includes identification of the warning signs of suicidal behavior and referral of a suicidal student to appropriate adults.

(cf. 5138 - Conflict Resolution/Peer Mediation)

When a suicide attempt or threat is reported, the principal or designee shall ensure student safety by taking the following actions:

1. Immediately securing medical treatment and/or mental health services as necessary

2. Notifying law enforcement and/or other emergency assistance if a suicidal act is being actively threatened

3. Keeping the student under continuous adult supervision until the parent/guardian and/or appropriate support agent or agency can be contacted and has the opportunity to intervene

4. Removing other students from the immediate area as soon as possible

(cf. 0450 - Comprehensive Safety Plan) (cf. 5141 - Health Care and Emergencies)

The principal or designee shall document the incident in writing, including the steps that the school took in response to the suicide attempt or threat.

(cf. 5125 - Student Records)

The Superintendent or designee shall follow up with the parent/guardian and student in a timely

AR 5141.52(d)

manner to provide referrals to appropriate services as needed. If the parent/guardian does not access treatment for the student, the Superintendent or designee may meet with the parent/guardian to identify barriers to treatment and assist the family in providing follow-up care for the student. If follow-up care is still not provided, the Superintendent or designee shall consider whether he/she is required, pursuant to laws for mandated reporters of child neglect, to refer the matter to the local child protective services agency.

(cf. 5141.4 - Child Abuse Prevention and Reporting)

For any student returning to school after a mental health crisis, the principal or designee and/or school counselor may meet with the parents/guardians and, if appropriate, with the student to discuss re-entry and appropriate next steps to ensure the student's readiness for return to school.

Postvention

In the event that a student dies by suicide, the Superintendent or designee shall communicate with the student's parents/guardians to offer condolences, assistance, and resources. In accordance with the laws governing confidentiality of student record information, the Superintendent or designee shall consult with the parents/guardians regarding facts that may be divulged to other students, parents/guardians, and staff.

The Superintendent or designee shall implement procedures to address students' and staff's grief and to minimize the risk of imitative suicide or suicide contagion. He/she shall provide students, parents/guardians, and staff with information, counseling, and/or referrals to community agencies as needed. School staff may receive assistance from school counselors or other mental health professionals in determining how best to discuss the suicide or attempted suicide with students.

Any response to media inquiries shall be handled by the district-designated spokesperson who shall not divulge confidential information. The district's response shall not sensationalize suicide and shall focus on the district's postvention plan and available resources.

After any suicide or attempted suicide by a student, the Superintendent or designee shall provide an opportunity for all staff who responded to the incident to debrief, evaluate the effectiveness of the strategies used, and make recommendations for future actions.





2017-2018 Special Tax Levy

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Westside Union School District is the legislative body (the "legislative body") of the Westside Union School District Community Facilities District No. 2005-1 (the "District"); and

WHEREAS, the District formed pursuant to the terms and provisions of the "Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982", being Chapter 2.5, Part 1, Division 2, Title 5 of the Government Code of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, this legislative body, as authorized by Section 53340 of the Government Code of the State of California, has authorized the levy of special tax to pay for costs and expenses related to said District, and this legislative body is desirous to establish the specific rate of the special tax to be collected for the next fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the above recitals are all true and correct.

SECTION 2. That the specific rate and amount of the special tax to be collected to pay for the costs and expenses for fiscal year 2017-2018 for the referenced District is hereby determined and established as set forth in the attached, referenced and incorporated as Exhibit "A."

SECTION 3. That the rate as set forth in Exhibit "A" does not exceed the amount as previously authorized by this legislative body, and is not in excess of that previously approved by the qualified electors of the District, and is in compliance with Section XIIID of the California State Constitution, which was enacted with the passage of Proposition 218.

SECTION 4. That the proceeds of the special tax shall be used to pay, in whole or in part, the costs of the following:

A. Payment of principal of and interest on any outstanding authorized bonded indebtedness; and

B. Necessary replenishment of bond reserve funds or other reserve funds; and

- C. Payment of costs and expenses of authorized public facilities; and
- D. Repayment of advances and loans, if applicable; and
- E. Payment of District administrative costs.

The proceeds of the special taxes shall be used as set forth above, and shall not be used for any other purposes.

SECTION 5. The special tax shall be collected in the same manner as ordinary ad valorem property taxes are collected, and shall be subject to the same penalties and same procedures and sale in cases of any delinquency for ad valorem taxes, and the Tax Collector is hereby authorized to deduct reasonable administrative costs incurred in collecting any said special tax.

SECTION 6. All monies above collected shall be paid into the District funds, including any bond fund and reserve fund.

SECTION 7. The Auditor-Controller of the County is hereby directed to enter in the next County assessment roll on which taxes will become due, opposite each lot or parcel of land affected in a space marked "public improvements, special tax" or by any other suitable designation, the installment of the special tax, and for the exact rate and amount of said tax, reference is made to the attached Exhibit "A."

SECTION 8. The County Auditor-Controller shall then, at the close of the tax collection period, promptly render the District a detailed report showing the amount and/or amounts of such special tax installments, interest, penalties and percentages to be collected and from what property collected, and also provide a statement of any percentages retained for the expense of making any such collection.

RESOLUTION OF THE WESTSIDE UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT BOARD OF TRUSTEES, ACTING AS THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF THE WESTSIDE UNION SCHOOL DISTRICT COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2007-1, AUTHORIZING THE LEVY OF SPECIAL TAXES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2017-2018

2017-2018 Special Tax Levy

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Westside Union School District is the legislative body (the "legislative body") of the Westside Union School District Community Facilities District No. 2007-1 (the "District"); and

WHEREAS, the District formed pursuant to the terms and provisions of the "Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982", being Chapter 2.5, Part 1, Division 2, Title 5 of the Government Code of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, this legislative body, as authorized by Section 53340 of the Government Code of the State of California, has authorized the levy of special tax to pay for costs and expenses related to said District, and this legislative body is desirous to establish the specific rate of the special tax to be collected for the next fiscal year.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the above recitals are all true and correct.

SECTION 2. That the specific rate and amount of the special tax to be collected to pay for the costs and expenses for fiscal year 2017-2018 for the referenced District is hereby determined and established as set forth in the attached, referenced and incorporated as Exhibit "A."

SECTION 3. That the rate as set forth in Exhibit "A" does not exceed the amount as previously authorized by this legislative body, and is not in excess of that previously approved by the qualified electors of the District, and is in compliance with Section XIIID of the California State Constitution, which was enacted with the passage of Proposition 218.

SECTION 4. That the proceeds of the special tax shall be used to pay, in whole or in part, the costs of the following:

A. Payment of principal of and interest on any outstanding authorized bonded indebtedness; and

B. Necessary replenishment of bond reserve funds or other reserve funds; and

- C. Payment of costs and expenses of authorized public facilities; and
- D. Repayment of advances and loans, if applicable; and
- E. Payment of District administrative costs.

The proceeds of the special taxes shall be used as set forth above, and shall not be used for any other purposes.

SECTION 5. The special tax shall be collected in the same manner as ordinary ad valorem property taxes are collected, and shall be subject to the same penalties and same procedures and sale in cases of any delinquency for ad valorem taxes, and the Tax Collector is hereby authorized to deduct reasonable administrative costs incurred in collecting any said special tax.

SECTION 6. All monies above collected shall be paid into the District funds, including any bond fund and reserve fund.

SECTION 7. The Auditor-Controller of the County is hereby directed to enter in the next County assessment roll on which taxes will become due, opposite each lot or parcel of land affected in a space marked "public improvements, special tax" or by any other suitable designation, the installment of the special tax, and for the exact rate and amount of said tax, reference is made to the attached Exhibit "A."

SECTION 8. The County Auditor-Controller shall then, at the close of the tax collection period, promptly render the District a detailed report showing the amount and/or amounts of such special tax installments, interest, penalties and percentages to be collected and from what property collected, and also provide a statement of any percentages retained for the expense of making any such collection.

PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE ANNUAL BUDGET REPORT: July 1, 2017 Budget Adoption

This document fulfills the requirements of subparagraphs (B) and (C) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (a) of Education Code Section 42127.

(i) The minimum recommended reserve for economic uncertainties for each fiscal year identified in the budget are as follows:

2017-18 : 3% or \$2,792,103 2018-19 : 3% or \$2,591,027 2018-19 : 3% or \$2,662,470

(ii) The combined assigned and unassigned ending fund balances that are in excess of the minimum recommended reserve for economic uncertainties for each fiscal year identified in the budget are as follows:

2017-18 : \$4,202,283 2018-19 : \$3,126,128 2019-20 : \$1,555,356

(iii) The statement of reasons that substantiates the need for an assigned and unassigned ending fund balance that is in excess of the minimum recommended reserve for economic uncertainties for each fiscal year identified in item (ii) above is as follows:

The experience of the past nine years has clearly demonstrated these minimum levels are not sufficient to protect educational programs from severe disruption in an economic downturn. A 3% reserve minimum represents approximately 8 days of payroll for Westside Union School District (WUSD). Many school districts have established reserve policies calling for higher than minimum reserves, for a number of reasons, including:

- Rating agencies like Fitch or Moody's typically assess the adequacy of a district's reserves by comparing them to statewide averages, which is approximately 15% for California unified school districts in recent years.
- The Fiscal Crisis and Management Assistance Team (FCMAT), the state-chartered school district finance consulting agency, emphasizes the need to assess not only fund balance but also actual cash on hand. Among the key factors WUSD is considering in maintaining its present level of reserves are:
 - Buffering the impact of recent deficit spending
 - Protection against exposure to significant one-time outlays such as disasters, lawsuits, or material audit findings.
 - Protection against the volatility of state revenues.
 - · Cash management/avoiding the cost of borrowing cash.
 - · Protection against volatile enrollment patterns in the Antelope Valley.
 - Protection to cover increases in fixed and statutory costs, including STRS/PERS.

Of all the reasons for carrying higher than minimum reserves, protecting against state revenue volatility is one of the most compelling. This is especially true during LCFF implementation because gap percentage funding is correlated with Prop. 98 growth, and critically true as long as deficit spending patterns continue.

It is also worth noting that the portion of the ending fund balance which had been assigned for transfer into an irrevocable trust to satisfy Other Post Employment Benefit (OPEB) obligations has now been distributed to employees as one-time compensation. This reduction in reserves further increases the need to maintain existing fund balance, as the buffer, with respect to benefit costs and increases that the trust would have provided, no longer exists.

- No more than 75 percent of the maximum of moneys held in any fund during a current fiscal year may be transferred.

BACKGROUND:

With the November 2012 passage of Proposition 30, Article XIII, Section 36 was added to the California Constitution creating in the state General Fund an Education Protection Account (EPA). The Education Protection Account (EPA) is the vehicle for collecting and distributing funds which are generated by the temporary increases, beginning in 2012-13, to personal income taxes (retroactive to January 1, 2012, and in place for seven years, ending in 2018), and sales tax (effective January 1, 2013, and in place for four years, ending in 2016) authorized by Proposition 30. Similar to local property taxes, districts' State Aid is reduced by one dollar for each dollar received from the EPA. The EPA becomes, in essence, a third revenue limit source in addition to local property tax revenue and State Aid.

Each school district shall have the sole authority to determine how the monies received from the Education Protection Account are spent in the schools within its jurisdiction, and may not use the funds for administrative costs. The Governing Board shall approve the spending determinations in an open session of a public board meeting of the governing board, held at least annually and prior to the recording of EPA expenditures. For the 2017-2018 fiscal year, the Westside Union School District is proposing to spend the EPA on Instructional Personnel Costs, including salaries and benefits.

WHEREAS, the voters approved Proposition 30 on November 6, 2012 and approved Proposition 55 on November 8, 2016; and

WHEREAS, Proposition 30 added Article XIII, Section 36 to the California Constitution effective November 7, 2012; and

WHEREAS, the provisions of Article XIII, Section 36(e) create in the state General Fund an Education Protection Account (EPA) to receive and disburse the revenues derived from the incremental increases in taxes imposed; and

WHEREAS, before June 30th of each year, the Director or Supervisor of Fiscal Services shall estimate the total amount of additional revenues, less refunds that will be derived from the incremental increases in tax rates that will be available for transfer into the Education Protection Account during the next fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, if the sum determined by the State Controller is positive, the State Controller shall transfer the amount calculated into the Education Protection Account within ten days preceding the end of the fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, all monies in the Education Protection Account are hereby continuously appropriated for the support of the school district; and

WHEREAS, monies deposited in the Education Protection Account shall not be used to pay any costs incurred by the Legislature, the Governor or any agency of state government; and

WHEREAS, a school district shall have the sole authority to determine how the monies received from the Education Protection Account are spent in the schools within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the governing board of the district shall make the spending determinations with respect to monies received from the Education Protection Account in open session of a public meeting of the governing board; and

WHEREAS, the monies received from the Education Protection Account shall not be used for salaries or benefits for administrators or any other administrative cost; and

WHEREAS, each school district shall annually publish on its Internet website an accounting of how much money was received from the Education Protection Account and how that money was spent; and

WHEREAS, the annual independent financial and compliance audit required of the school district shall ascertain and verify whether the funds provided from the Education Protection Account have been properly disbursed and expended as required by Article XIII, Section 36 of the California Constitution; and

WHEREAS, expenses incurred by the school district to comply with the additional audit requirements of Article XII, Section 36 may be paid with funding from the Education Protection Account and shall not be considered administrative costs for purposes of Article XIII, Section 36.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Governing Board of the Westside Union School District, as required by Article XIII, Section 36 has made the spending determination of the monies received from the Education Protection Account in an open session of a public meeting, following a public hearing in which public testimony was taken, in which discussing regarding the proposed uses of the monies took place; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Governing Board of the Westside Union School District, in compliance with Article XIII, Section 36(e), with the California Constitution, has determined to spend the monies received from the Education Protection Account as follows:

All budget adjustments and transfers must be made in accordance with the provisions of Education Code Sections 42600, 42601, 42602, 42603, and 42610, and processed using the appropriate forms and documentation as provided by the County Office, and in compliance with applicable district guidelines; and
